

Foodlink hosts panel discussion about moving beyond charity to solve food insecurity

Event at Three Heads Brewing to address ways to transform food banking

ROCHESTER – For decades, Foodlink has explored innovative solutions to address food insecurity and move beyond the traditional model of food banking.

On Wednesday, a few leading voices on this topic will visit Rochester to share their research and knowledge during an event at Three Heads Brewing (186 Atlantic Ave., Rochester) entitled: "Beyond Charity: Ideas to transform our broken food system."

Author and activist **Andy Fisher**, who wrote "Big Hunger," analyzes how the emergency food system transformed from a stopgap measure, to an industry compromised by corporate interests. Fisher, who founded the Community Food Security Coalition in 1994, faults some anti-hunger groups for not addressing the root causes of hunger, such as economic inequality.

Daniel Bernhard of Mushroom Cloud, a Toronto-based consulting firm, has co-authored a report on Social Purpose Grocery (SPG) retail, which he argues would be a more efficient and viable way to provide food assistance, as opposed to food banking.

"Foodlink continually seeks ways to innovate and respond to the local need by creating outsidethe-box solutions that target the root causes of food insecurity," said Executive Director Julia Tedesco. "We're thrilled that the guests we're welcoming to Rochester Wednesday will challenge our ways of thinking even more and urge us to reimagine how we can drive systemic change that permanently shortens emergency food lines across our region."

Foodlink's Chief Programs Officer, Mitch Gruber, will sit on a panel with Fisher and Bernhard to bring a local perspective to the conversation, and discuss recent initiatives launched by Foodlink to help improve healthy food access in underserved communities. Foodlink's Executive Director, Julia Tedesco, will moderate the discussion, and light snacks prepared by the Foodlink Community Kitchen will be available for attendees.
